Section I: Degree/Program Requirements

A. Institutional graduation requirements for this degree program.

The graduation requirements for a transfer student pursuing this major are no different than the graduation requirements for a native student, including the minimum number of semester hours required for graduation. Specifically, the student must meet the following requirements:

- Complete at least 120 credit hours;
- Successfully complete the required coursework in the major (may be a combination of prior college and FLC courses);
- Successfully complete any auxiliary requirements (may be a combination of prior college and FLC courses);
- Successfully complete two Fort Lewis College *Education for Global Citizenship* (EGC) courses;
- Successfully complete at least 45 upper division (300/400 level) credit hours;
- Earn a minimum 2.0 Cumulative GPA in courses taken at FLC, as well as a minimum 2.0 GPA for those courses taken at FLC accepted to meet the requirements for the major and any minor course of study.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

- A. Grade Eligibility.
Only academic courses with a letter grade of "C-" or better are transferable. Courses with grades of "F", "D", "IP", "I", "S", "U", "AU", and "Z" are not transferable. Fort Lewis College will accept and count toward meeting graduation requirements all state guaranteed general education courses that have a grade of C- or better.
- B. Fort Lewis College accepts scores of 3 and above on advanced placement tests and scores of 4 and above earned on international baccalaureate tests.
- C. Fort Lewis College will accept all approved credits earned within ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier may be evaluated on an individual basis.
- D. Fort Lewis College may apply a state guaranteed general education course toward the major or other graduation requirements if that facilitates the student's graduation more effectively.

Section III: Appeals Process

- A. Institutional Appeal Process

Students who follow this agreement shall have the right to appeal a transfer decision that appears to be inconsistent with the terms and courses listed in this agreement. Appeals pertaining to this transfer guide should be filed with the institution. A student may file an appeal that pertains to state guaranteed general education courses directly to CCHE.
